#### Pick Up

If by chance you need to arrange someone other than yourself to collect your child from school, please call the school to let us know the circumstances and name of the person.

#### Absences, late arrivals and early pick ups for School

If for some reason you are late to school or need to pick up your child early, please call into the office and complete a pink form (partial absence slip).

Likewise, if your child is not well or away from school for any reason, please call the school on **49335323** to let us know the circumstances. If we haven't heard by the second day of absence a phone call will be made to parents.

If your child will be absent for over 10 school days, please see Mrs. Coffey. Also please inform your child's teacher as soon as you know this will be happening.

#### **Covid Changes**

If your child tests positive to Covid, you are still required to inform the school and NSW Health. The child will have to stay at home for 7 days from the positive test. The greatest change is in regard to close/household contact. Please see the following flowchart.

#### Award System at Nillo Infants School

At Nillo Infants School there is a reward system in place and students have the opportunity to be recognised for quality work and exemplary behaviour in various ways. Each day we have a playground "Tin" and student's names are placed in the Tin for many opportunities witnessed by the teachers on playground duty. This can include kindness to others, developing a new skill, collaboration with others and sportsmanship in games.

On Assembly day all these names are in the draw for the Playground Award at Assembly.

All students have a sticker book they are responsible for. When they receive recognition for anything in class they are given a sticker, which they place in their sticker book and when they have accumulated 7 stickers they receive a small merit award. Once they receive 7 small merit awards they receive a large green merit award and when they get to 3 of these they will be presented with a rainbow award at the following Assembly. The sticker book continues on with the student each year.

At our Assemblies, each class hands out 3 Class Achievement awards and one You Can Do It Award. The You Can Do It Awards are highly valued as they are limited. We also have the Super Reader Awards where students are recognised for 25 nights of reading, up to 200 nights of reading. These readers are designed to be at a level that students can read independently and should be at a lower level than they are reading in class. With the Super Reader program, parents should sign off each night their child completes some home reading. When 25 nights of reading have been completed, the green Super Reader record should be returned to their class teacher, so that their reading efforts are recognised and an award can be given out at the next assembly.

Our students have had so much fun doing their Gymnastics lessons. They have been learning to balance and lots of other skills.



#### **Book Week Parade**

We will be celebrating Book Week on the **24**<sup>th</sup> **August**. At 9.30am we are fortunate to have an author **Belinda Kidd** coming to read the students a story. The theme for this year is "**DREAMING WITH EYES OPEN**" and students may dress to the theme or any favourite book character. So please start thinking about that great costume idea. This is always a wonderful day for our students.
